Field Investigators Driving Past Bigfoot

Details of Encounter:

We had spent the day hiking several areas in a nearby Wildlife Management Area with no interesting evidence to show for our efforts. Sometimes we feel like we are just not in the right place at the right time. On such days, out of frustration, we occasionally decide to try another area in our belief that they just might be there at that time. We know they migrate even within a few miles of the area, whether it be for food, water, or just a change of scenery. Who knows why? Since we spend an average of almost 50 days and 40 nights a year in the woods without any results, we are well adapted to disappointment.

As we turned off the highway onto this old, paved stretch of road, we noted that it was a moonless night. In this type of situation, I am always appreciative of the six forward-facing LED bar lights on the front of our research vehicle. It seems like there can never be too much light when driving in the woods. We were about 4 miles in when we came around a bend in the road, only to see a darkly dressed person standing in the middle of the road. We immediately wondered why a person would be doing that in total darkness and all dressed in black. I immediately noted and mentioned to Dave that I found it weird that a person would not even look our way when illuminated with 2000 lumens of light. The normal action of a person in this situation, when suddenly seeing all this light on a vehicle moving towards them, would be to look towards the vehicle and then to step closer to the side of the road for obvious safety reasons. But this "being" made no attempt to move, so I slowed down to approximately 5 miles an hour and started studying the details about him. As we got closer and closer, we estimated his height at 6'5"or more, and muscular. His unusually dark clothing did not seem normal, and he was without anything reflective on, and he did not appear to be carrying a flashlight.

I wanted to stop and just study him, but received resistance to this from my other passengers. Even as we drove by him, he did not move or even look towards us. Logic dictates that a person would not walk 4 miles into the woods on a moonless night without any light.
